SEMINAR COURSE IN CULTURAL RESOURCES AND TRADITIONAL CULTURAL PROPERTIES MANAGEMENT

Course Description

What is the difference between Traditional Cultural Properties and all of the rest of the cultural sites and historic properties located in the United States? This course will examine the controversial aspects of the nomenclature and cultural belief systems involved in the Cultural Resources Management industry. What Traditional Cultural Properties should be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places? Currently the National Register excludes TCPs from being listed and there is a movement to change the designation in Indian Country. What does it mean to rethink the eligibility of TCPs for the National Register from a traditional framework? Is it discriminatory to exclude TCPs from the National Register? What is a traditional cultural landscape? How does it impact the National Register? How are things changing in the treatment of TCPs both on and off reservations? We will discuss Tribal Historic Preservation Offices and the implications of TCP protections which impact the work being done in CRM. We will discuss the implications of what changes have occurred in the past and that will occur over the next several years. We will discuss the application of Cultural Resource Codes by Tribal Historic Preservation Offices. How many tribes in the country have CRCs? How many tribes have THPO offices? What are some best practices when interacting with tribes? Some tribes have well-established THPO offices. Others tribes are in the process of developing cultural resources codes or have other offices that handle the work. We will learn about the legal, historic, and cultural awareness tools necessary to understand how to build on the relationships with tribal governments, THPO offices, and interacting with Traditional Cultural Specialists (TCS) in the field.
